Tractor Pull Rules & Regulations (2025)

Fee per weight class/hook up: \$15

- Tractor years: 1880-1980
- Tractors must retain stock appearance
- Gasoline, LP, and Diesel tractors only. No Alcohol. No Nitrous
- Wheelie bars 10" maximum above the ground. The back of the wheelie bar is to extend 5" behind the tire radius. Pads 5" square minimum, spaced minimum of 20" from outside of each pad
- Draw bar must be stationary with limited movement
- Maximum hitch height of 20"
- Hole for the hitch must be 3" wide x $3\frac{3}{4}$ " long in order to fit the hook on the sled
- No part of draw bar can be touching sled chain while pulling
- Regular or radial tires are legal. Discretion with tires will be track officials' call
- No tire chains, half tracks, crawler tractors and no implements on tractors
- Tractor must have working brakes
- Use of factory T A and Multi-power will be allowed one time only
- Drivers must remain seated during the pull with at least one hand on the steering wheel
- Each puller has one attempt to pass the 10 foot mark. Pull is official after the 10 foot mark is passed
- Excessive loss of liquid (stream or intermittent stream) discharged on the track will be red-flagged
- If any weights fall off tractor the pull will be disqualified
- The pull will be red-flagged and measured at the spot the tractor runs out of bounds if any part of the tractor or sled crosses the boundary line
- Pull is over when forward motion of sled is stopped or red flag is dropped
- You may not bring your tractor onto the track until the flagman allows you to do so. No packing the track. Tractors must be in neutral and hands off the controls when a man is hooking you on. No jerking of the sled is allowed. You must tighten the chain before pulling
- No one is allowed on the track except pullers and officials
- No reckless driving of tractors will be permitted on or off the track. Track officials may disqualify any tractor driver for unsportsman-like conduct, intoxication, or failure to stop when red-flagged
- No alcohol is to be consumed prior to or during event by driver
- No riders on the tractors in any area of the event
- Rules are subject to revision at any time by track officials
- At all times the tractors, drivers, and pulls will be governed by track officials and flagmen. Track official's rulings and decisions are final
- Pullers 17 years of age and younger must have a signed release by parent or guardian to pull
- Maximum tire width: 18.4"
